Study and analysis of foreign experience in securing digital rights at the level of national legislation	January - June 2024	<p>Work was carried out to study the regulatory and scientific materials of foreign countries' experience in the field of securing digital rights at the national level. A comparative analysis was conducted, an analytical review was compiled for 9 jurisdictions at the level of regulation of certain digital rights.</p> <p>As part of the study of scientific papers on the experience of legal regulation of digital rights in individual countries, a search was conducted for publications in the following databases: Elsevier, Wiley, ResearchGate, Google Scholar, eLibrary. Publication dates were limited to the period from 2016 to 2023. When searching for publications using different databases, some of the filters in them were identical. At the identification stage, the total number of sources was n = 3278 sources. As a result, about 86 sources were selected and examined within the screening. Based on this work, an analytical review was compiled, which became the basis for the publication of a scientific article in a foreign scientific journal: Assel Kaishatayeva, Flura Ibragimova, Rassima Bayazitova, Nurolla Yessenzholov. Development of legislation :</p> <p>- The research results can serve as a basis for the formation or improvement of national legislation in the field of digital rights, taking into account successful practices of foreign countries. This will create a more effective legal framework that promotes the protection of citizens' digital rights.</p> <p>2. Comparative analysis :</p> <p>- An analytical review of 9 jurisdictions provides an opportunity to identify best practices and shortcomings of various approaches to regulating digital rights. This will help Russian and Kazakh legislators adapt successful models to local conditions.</p> <p>3. Raising legal awareness :</p> <p>- The research can be used to create training materials for lawyers, government officials and students, which will increase the level of legal awareness</p>

The stages of this section are scheduled for full implementation by August 2024, and therefore the work has begun and is at the implementation stage. Based on the completed research, work has begun to determine the advantages and problems of legal consolidation of individual digital rights, and certain legal strategies in this area have been identified. Work has begun to compile a guide to the conceptual apparatus of digital rights. Also, within the framework of this section, the following articles have been prepared and sent to scientific journals recommended by the Committee (currently at the review stage): 1.
